Washington DC's Historic Woodland Garden

The wild gardens of Tregaron Estate are among the finest historic landmarks of Washington, DC.

A former private estate located in the heart of Northwest Washington, Tregaron is now open to the public and is a beloved green oasis in the city.



Designed a century ago by pioneering landscape architect Ellen Shipman, Tregaron is among the very few remaining naturalistic wild gardens of its era.

What's in a Name?

Tregaron means “village of three wells” in Welsh. When built in 1912, the estate was named “the Causeway” after its iconic stone driveway. When Marjorie Merriweather Post and Joseph Davies purchased the estate, they renamed it after his ancestral home in Wales, added a nine-hole golf course and hundreds of azaleas, and hosted extravagant social events in the gardens.



Renewing Green Space in the City



Tregaron Conservancy became the owner and steward of the landscape in 2006.

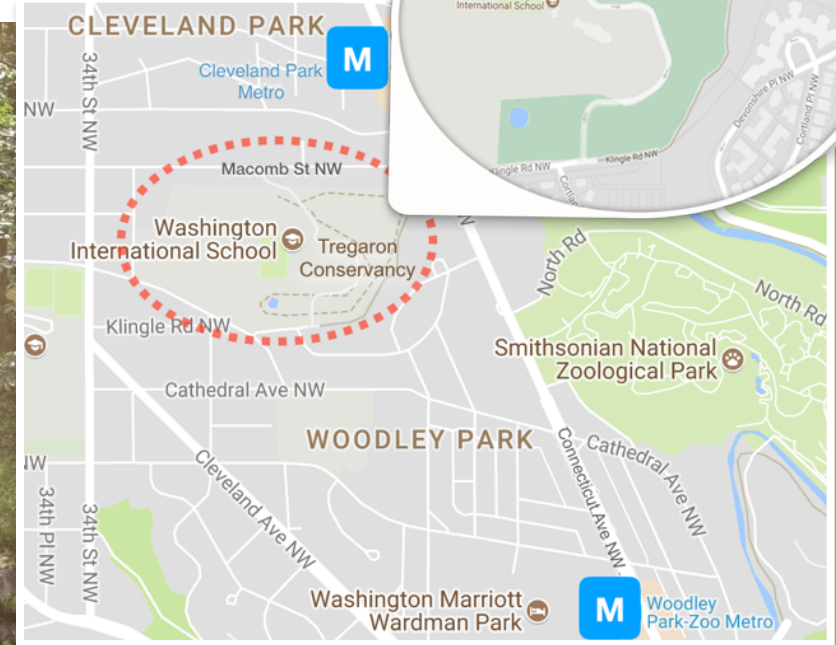
With dedicated volunteers and community support, the Conservancy has reconstructed Shipman's Lily Pond, reopened trails, removed hundreds of fallen trees, planted trees and new wild gardens, unearthed magnificent stone features, and restored the natural flow of streams.
